
The Life and Many, Many Deaths of Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi



 December 2012: Reportedly arrested by Iraqi counter-terrorism unit

November 2014: Reported killed in an air raid on a ten-truck convoy outside of Mosul

 March 2015: Reportedly lost day-to-day control of I-CIA-SIS after being seriously inured in airstrike on western Iraq



- June 2016: Reported killed in a coalition strike on Ragga

 October 2016: Reportedly "at death's door" after being poisoned by an assassin in Iraq

- May 2017: Russia claims it "may have killed" Baghdadi in an air strike on Raqqa

- July 2017: The "Syrian Observatory For Human Rights" (aka Osama Suleiman going by the pseudonym Rami Abdulrahman from his house in Coventry, which establishment lapdog Time dutifully notes "is considered a more reliable source than others — its reports about events in Syria are frequently cited by international news organizations") swore Baghdadi "really is dead this time" after an undescribed encounter in Syria's Deir al-Zour province, but, sadly for Suleiman, Baghdadi himself popped up the next month to dispute the claim.
